School Improvement Plan

What is the purpose of the school improvement plan?

A School Improvement Plan (SIP) is:

- a road map that establishes the changes that the school needs to improve student achievement and shows how and when these changes will be made
- a timed education development plan that embodies the vision and mission of the school.



School priorities?

Vaughan has a three-year School Improvement plan. All plans are subject to amendment and changes may happen linked to internal or external factors.

Although the plan may run for three to five years - each year priorities may come on or off the plan depending on the timescales set or changes in the educational landscape.

The priorities identified are strategic and are linked to long term visions and goals for the pupil community and incorporate whole groups of the school community. This is then filtered down operationally to the day to day running and overall effectiveness of the school. What it isn't, is a personal plan for each child. This is done through other forms of monitoring and self evaluation at the school.
