It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. 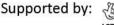
- Develop or add to the PESSPA activities that your school already offer

DfE encourages schools to use this template as an effective way of meeting the reporting requirements of the Primary PE and sport premium.

At Vaughan Primary the total allocation of PE and Sports Premium for academic year 2022/23 is £21,330.













By providing the lessons and teaching the skills outlined below, Vaughan has met its obligations under the National Curriculum, according to the DfE. However, we recognise the benefits of being able to swim and aim for all pupils to achieve the standards. Therefore, although we are not required to offer additional lessons if pupils don't achieve the requirements above, we will:

- Offer extra-curricular 'top-up' lessons for the pupils who need them, if possible
- Notify the pupils' parents that they're struggling

We have planned to allocate funding for booster sessions for up to 20 pupils from Years 5 and 6 who weren't able to meet the swimming requirements of the National Curriculum. (See Key Indicator 4 for details)

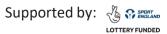

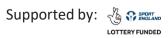
