### PICK 2 TASKS PER HALF TERM

#### SCIENCE

**Sound:** Create a simple instrument (e.g., elastic band guitar or rice shaker). Write a short paragraph explaining how the sound is made and how you can change the pitch (tighter bands, more rice, etc.).

#### PE

**Dance: (Cats)**  
Choose an emotion of a cat (happy, angry, excited, playful). Create a video to show movements that express that feeling and explain your choices for those actions.

#### History

**Anglo-Saxons**  
Create a factfile about Anglo-Saxons (poster/powerpoint)  
Where they came from  
What homes were like  
Jobs they did  
Interesting facts.

#### Art

**Mechanisms:**  
Make a simple moving picture using a slider or split pin. Explain how the mechanism makes it move.
